

Statutory Declaration



Important Information - Please Read Carefully

This statutory declaration is to be used by rural dog owners when applying for their dog/s to be registered as working and therefore exempt from the requirement to microchip; and for rural dog owners to apply for a rebate from Thames-Coromandel District Council for dog registration fees for fourth or subsequent working dogs. To be eligible for the rebate and/or microchip exemption you must truthfully answer all the questions set out below and have your declaration witnessed by a Solicitor, a Justice of the Peace, or a Registrar of the Court.

Terms and Conditions

1. A “working dog” is any dog that is kept solely or principally for the purpose of herding or driving stock.
2. The Thames-Coromandel District Council reserves the right to determine whether any dog can be classified as a working dog.
3. You must submit this form with your registration form to be eligible for any rebate.
4. Your dog registration fees must be paid on or before the due date to be eligible for any rebates.
