

# KÕPŪ MARINE PRECINCT

State-of-the-art infrastructure supports commercial maritime activities.

Strategically positioned, the wharf connects key cities and two of NZ's busiest ports, making it a vital hub for regional growth.



### **KEY FEATURES**

#### **SLIPWAY**

- Capacity: Designed to handle vessels up to 150 tonnes
- Dimensions:

Width: 12 metres

Length: 32 metres

• **Boat handling:** A catwalk adjacent to the slipway provides easy access for hauling, cleaning, servicing and repairs

#### PONTOON

- Vessel accommodation: Accommodates vessels up to 25 metres long and 5 metres wide
- Maintenance and repairs: Perfect for shortterm maintenance, including interior cleaning, minor painting and inspections, without requiring vessels to be hauled out
- **Power supply:** Hosts a sixth power outlet box, providing 32 or 63 Amp shore power

#### WHARF

- **Dimensions:** A 4.8-metre-wide concrete wharf extending 80 metres into the Waihou River
- Vehicle access: Rated for 24-tonne axle loading, allowing for direct access for loading and unloading goods
- **T-head design:** The T-head allows vessels to tie up parallel to the current, with a floating pontoon for all-tide access
- **Berthage capacity:** The wharf can accommodate multiple vessels simultaneously, with 70m of wharf face to tie up to
- Power and water connections:

5 power outlet boxes offering 32 or 63 Amp shore power connections 2 water taps

• Safety features: Lockable access gate, CCTV and overhead lighting ensure secure and safe operations

#### **COMMERCIAL HAULAGE AREA**

- **Truck and heavy vehicle parking:** Approximately 7,000m<sup>2</sup> gravel area for haulage and parking
- **Back-up ramp:** The existing unsealed boat ramp provides a back-up to the concrete slipway for vessel haulage
