Meeting the needs of people who cannot use standard accessible toilets

What is happening in Porritt Park?

In 2023 it will be transformed into a destination playground that will:

- reflect the history of the area and the community's input and involvement
- feature stronger and more challenging play equipment for all ages and abilities
- provide an all-day experience for families/ whānau to come together
- be a gathering place for all

What is a destination playground?

A place to spend the day, trying out all the equipment, having a picnic/barbeque with family, experiencing water play, or learning how to weave flax.

This is the FIRST destination playground in New Zealand to be built outside a major city

PLUS ... there will be a Changing Places bathroom to meet the needs of people who cannot use standard accessible toilets, only the sixth one to be built in NZ.
